

Travel Photography Tips



Learn how to trick your camera's light meter













Hints

- Take advantage of the 'halfway' shutter
 - If there's a bright element in the background (sky, sun, streetlight, white wall) point the camera down and 'lock' the exposure, then recompose
 - If your subject is within 10' use your flash to 'fill'
 - Get closer to your subject to exclude the elements that fool the meter
















Organizing Your Photos

- Don't delete until you download
- Editing is a three step process
 - Technical
 - Subject
 - Composition
- Use tags or keywords

Picking, Tagging, Keywording

- 1) Sort by date
 - 2) 1=great 2=potential
 - 3) Re-sort by 1's and 2's and use editing software to crop, exposure, etc
-
- Windows – Photo Gallery
 - Mac – Photos
 - Recommended: Lightroom

- Share on a free website – flickr, tumblr, 500px
- Prints – Costco, Walmart, Mpix, AdoramaPix
- Book – Apple, Shutterfly


